Cypress Woods High School is a public high school located in the suburbs of northwest Houston, Texas; we are located approximately 26 miles from the heart of the city. The surrounding community is largely residential and diversely populated with low, middle, and upper middle class families.

Cypress Woods is one of twelve high schools in the Cypress Fairbanks ISD, a ninth – twelfth grade campus, with 3439 students in attendance.

Accomplishments

Cypress Woods High School is one of the most outstanding schools in the Cypress Fairbanks Independent School District. Cy-Woods students excel in academics, extracurricular activities, athletics, and other areas.

Cypress Woods has earned the rating of *Met Standard* from the Texas Education Agency, the higher of the two ratings under the new system. In May 2017, USA News & World Report ranked Cy-Woods 1,451 out of more than 20,000 high schools nationally and 143 in the State of Texas.
